Reacting to Chancellor of the Exchequer Rishi Sunak's £30 billion package of measures, county council leader Councillor Andrew Proctor said: "I welcome the Chancellor's £30 billion plan to help our economy recover from the pandemic. Norwich Western Link Consultation to launch later this month

Norfolk County Council is planning to launch a public consultation later this month as part of its project to create the Norwich Western Link, a new 3.8 mile dual carriageway road between Broadland Northway and the A47.

The Local Access Consultation will focus on how the council can best support people to walk, cycle and use public transport in the area to the west of Norwich, and for opinions on proposals for existing local roads that cross the planned Norwich Western Link. Information gathered from this consultation will help inform design decisions and proposals for the project.

New kit and vehicles for Firefighters across Norfolk have received £1.44m of new kit as part of an investment by Norfolk County Council in technology and equipment.

In addition, five new multi-purpose tactical response vehicles (TRV) are due to be put into service this month, to enhance NFRS's capacity in extreme weather conditions and at difficult to reach locations. These have cost a total of £187,000, including purchase cost and fitting them with specialist equipment.
