#### 6. District Councillor's End of Year Report 2017-18

#### **Topcroft**

Nine years ago, I started campaigning to ensure that the LS Area Action Plan included a roundabout. That was to some extent successful and I'm pleased to say that the County has now agreed to build a roundabout and has recently produced a design (attached). They have also been awarded a £3m government grant towards its construction which is expected to start next year. Two planning applications for the 1800 houses and the Long Stratton bypass have been submitted in the last few months.

The next Local Plan, called the Greater Norwich Local Plan, has now been initiated and is being done jointly with Norwich City Council and Broadland District Council. A call for sites has already taken place but no sites were put forward in Topcroft.

There have been no significant planning applications in Topcroft in the last year.

SNC reluctantly raised its part of the Council Tax by £5.00 for a Band D house this year, this being a rise of 3.6%. All Councillors now receive £1000 per year to spend on projects within their Wards. This last year I've given £100 for tree planting in Topcroft. Larger grants are available from SNC from a £50k Community Action Fund across the whole of South Norfolk. This year I've already applied for £4.3k on behalf of Alburgh Parish Council to assist in the purchase of the Homersfield Bridge picnic site, which the County Council has declared as "surplus to their requirements".

SNC also has a Community Awards Scheme to recognize the work of volunteers within South Norfolk. Two years ago, I nominated Topcroft Cricket Club and they won as "Community Wellbeing Group of the Year". Last year I nominated the River Waveney Trust and they won as South Norfolk's "Community Group of the Year".

The Boundary Commission completed a review of Ward boundaries the result of which is that from 2019 Topcroft will be part of the Hempnall Ward. This year SNC conducted a review of "Community Governance" in the District that included asking Parish Councils if they have views on changes to their parish arrangements. No changes are affecting Topcroft but the Earsham/Denton boundary is being moved so that 8 properties currently in Earsham are being moved into Denton.

During the year, I have continued to be a member of the Development Management Committee and the Regulation and Planning Policy Committee. I also regularly attend SNC Cabinet meetings and contribute to their debates
