Topcroft PCC Report

Annual Report 2020: Topcroft PCC

This year has been dominated by the Coronavirus Pandemic and we have been unable to have any fundraising events;

Throughout the year our church was open for private prayer;

In September the Norfolk Churches Trust Cycle Ride went ahead and three people from the Village took part to raise money for the church and the Trust;

The Revd. Michael Kingston's last Service in Topcroft was on 27th September and his last Service before retirement was in Hemphall Church on Sunday 4th October.

Tim Francis, Topcroft, is to be commissioned as an Authorised Worship Assistant;

There were no Services on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. This was due to floods following extremely heavy rain that closed roads in the area.

Throughout the year the church and the village have work together during the Pandemic to make sure everyone was safe.

Weekly Thoughts and Prayers have been emailed to 85 participants. Recent Sunday Services via Zoom have been well received.

Our thanks to Peter Roger for all his hard work and dedication in keeping the Churchyard looking good.

We are working towards raising sufficient funds to have a new gate fitted at the entrance to the churchyard. The present one is in very bad repair.

Topcroft Social Club Report

Topcroft Social Club Annual Report 2021

Due to the ongoing pandemic, there is very little to report this year. The bar has been closed since the first lockdown, even when there was some relaxation of restrictions in the summer, as it is run by volunteers and does not serve food it was felt that the not impractical and not worthwhile to operate.

We did have an open air "picnic" on the field for Dawit attendees social distancing and providing their own food and drink. The cricket club did play some matches towards the end of the summer without using the pavilion except for toilets. Yoga and Pilates did operate for a short time during the summer when the restrictions allowed.

Looking forward: The Social Club committee do not anticipate opening the bar on a regular basis for the foreseeable future but do hope to organise an event for the community over the summer, weather and cricket fixtures permitting.

The cricket club hope to play a full season, they are currently only using the pavilion for toilets but are optimistic that they will be able to use the changing rooms and open the bar after matches as the regulations allow.

After the cricket in September and hopeful of continued relaxation of restrictions the social club will aim to open more often though we will need to assess demand and volunteers to decide whether we operate a regular club night or open only for events.

The regular sessions of Art, Yoga and Pilates are all hoping to restart soon after the May 17threlaxations.
