

Dear friends,

This summer I came across the story of Lucy Auge. Whist at university studying graphics Lucy became very ill after a fall. She was having seizures every day and thought her life was over. At home recovering her father used to carry her down to the bottom of the garden, as he gardened there. Lucy could not do very much but she began to notice things. She looked, really

looked at nature. Later she returned to university and completed her degree.

Lucy had always wanted to be an artist, but no one encouraged her or thought her capable. Deciding she had nothing to lose, she put on an exhibition of her own, inviting anyone she knew. She painted 500 flowers, using Japanese inks on antique paper she found in her godmothers attic dating from the 1920's. She priced her paintings at £40 because, "she wanted people to have something beautiful". Her paintings sold and now she is an established artist working in Bath.

Lucy said of her 500 Flowers Exhibition, "The pictures first to sell out always are the ones of weeds. Those are the ones people really want. I think it's because as soon as you pare them down and strip away everything, you can see the beauty in them. The painting honours them."

Weeds, who wants them? Yes they can harbour disease, and if left they will take ever larger amounts of space, water and nutrients away from our choice plants. We rarely see them as mature plants in their own right. A.A. Milne said, "Weeds are flowers too, once you get to know them." Perhaps we too need to get to

know them and appreciate them for their intrinsic beauty. A single red poppy; a pink Rosebay willow herb growing by the roadside, pink that gives way to feathery seed heads that moves oh so gracefully in the wind.

Sometimes we see people like weeds, not flowers. Each person has their own unique beauty, if we can but look and see.

The main meeting of the Vacancy in See Committee will be held on Tuesday 2 October 2018, with a public consultation being held on Wednesday 3 October, 2018 at 7.30pm in the Weston Room at Norwich Cathedral.

STUDY OF TIMBER-FRAMED HOUSES

The Norfolk Historic Buildings Group is made up of volunteers who study historic buildings in the county. In the past we have produced Journals on the historic buildings of New Buckenham, TacoIneston and Walsingham and have been examining timber-framed houses in Hempnall over the last few years. Our work can be seen at <u>www.nhbg.org.uk</u>

Hempnall provides an almost unique opportunity, as almost all the timberframed houses seem to have been built within about 100 years of each other between 1550 and 1650 - so provide an interesting study of the changes in techniques and styles over this period.

There have been delays in our studies for various reasons, but we are now restarting and would appreciate being allowed to look at some of the houses that we have not already seen. The process only takes a couple of hours and the three or four surveyors are all quite well house-trained.

Everyone who allows us access will receive a copy of the final printed study. Timber-framed houses in neighbouring parishes would also be of interest to us.
