Dear Friends,

Have you been watching Les Miserables on the television? The Miserables, as the name suggests does tend to sum up the programme. It is a sad, bleak story, set in France about 200 years ago, but a compelling story.

There are some thought provoking scenes, particularly when Jean Valjean meets a Bishop. Jean Valjean is a released convict, in prison for 19 years after stealing a loaf of bread. He is angry and bitter – nobody would give him accommodation because of his past. The Bishop does and feeds him. He leaves stealing some cutlery, but is arrested and returned to the Bishop, who instead of accusing him, forgives him, gives him additional loot – 2 silver candlesticks – and sends him on his way. I've done all I can he says.

This act of compassion and kindness is remembered by Jean Valjean in how he leads his life, and the help he gives to others throughout the rest of the story. He is always hounded by Chief Inspector Javert whose motto is 'once a prisoner, always a prisoner.'

The bible is full of stories of forgiving, not through what we do, but because of God's grace and love towards us.

- David loved someone else's wife and had her husband murdered.
- Saul who became Paul condemned and hated Christians before his miraculous Damascus Road experience.
- Peter denied his Lord 3 times.

Our lives may not be as tragic as Jean Valjean, but there are wrongs we have done we would like to put right. God forgives all who ask.

May be it is those acts of kindness and compassion that have an impact on the lives of others – sometimes we know about them, other times we are not aware of their impact.

Isaiah reminds us of the Lord's words 'Fear not for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name – you are mine, when you pass through the waters..... walk through the fire... I will be with you, since you are precious in my sight and because I love you.

MEMORIES AND STORIES OF THE WORLD WARS AND OTHER CONFLICTS

Did you know that the First World War wasn't officially over until the signing of The Treaty of Versailles on 28th June 1919?

This was exactly five years after the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand which directly led to World War I. The other Central Powers on the German side of World War I signed separate treaties. Although the armistice (ceasefire), signed

on 11 November 1918, ended the actual fighting, it took six months of Allied negotiations at the Paris Peace Conference to conclude the peace treaty.

St Andrews Church, Bedingham is hosting an event to commemorate the signing of The Treaty of Versailles on Saturday 29th June with displays of war memories and in the evening with a talk by Andrew Macdonald and Jason Kercher about the First World War.

We would like people to bring any family memorabilia and especially stories of people affected by war and these can be shared in the beautiful surroundings of Bedingham Church over refreshments during the afternoon and then to listen to the fascinating talk by Andrew and Jason who are amateur historians. We hope to have displays and are encouraging our school children to attend. All the schools and nurseries within our Group have been contacted asking if they would like to participate.

Details of ticket price for the evening talk (including refreshments) will be announced nearer the time and proceeds will be shared between Bedingham Church and The Royal British Legion. Should we receive a large response for the memorabilia displays this could be extended to a two day event extending to the Sunday.

Personal memories of war time.

Nearly every family has a story of war that passes down the generations. These stories rarely feature in any of the media and they are generally a small moment forever remembered of bravery, defiance, sadness, tragedy and yes, even humour and love. War is tragic and we must forever remember those who gave their lives in all conflicts and these stories are a poignant reminder of those times. Often, they are shared at funerals but I hope that this project will encourage families to also share their stories with new generations of people and protect them for all time. The stories may recall moments of action during the war but equally may reflect life "at home" or working in a reserved occupation.

They may be stories from any conflict, whether it be the First World War, the Second or more recently such as in the Falklands and Afghanistan. Indeed, any conflict from any age. These personal stories add a dimension to war time recollections and might provide a useful aid to schools. We tend to understand war only through the writings of politicians and generals so let's put pen to paper and broaden our understanding.

You may have noticed over the last month that there is a folder in the Church for people to leave their story for the benefit of others to read. So let's start to write these stories down and include them in the folder even before the event. A selection can be read out during the afternoon or at the evening talk and it is a wonderful and poignant way to remember those who gave their lives for our freedom.
