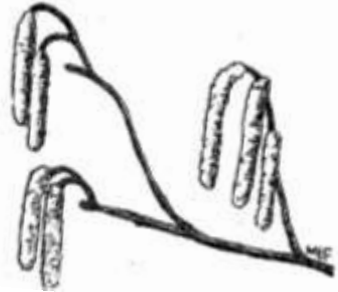

Dear Friends,

Looking out of my window this morning, I saw a dew covering the lawn. It changed its colour and when the droplets were caught by the low early sun they glistened.

If you look closely, dew drops form on the tips of pointed blades of grass. Apparently dew drops tend to accumulate at the tips of spindly leaves, even if that means defying gravity by moving upwards. How that happens is a source of wonder to me being non scientifically minded. A drop of dew, though seemingly insignificant in itself, is part of earth's life support system, an essential indispensable part.

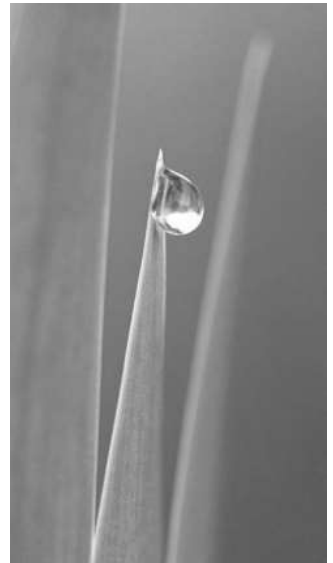
A single dew drop is small, fragile and beautiful. It causes no damage. It provides a source of water for plants to enabling them to grow. *This is especially important in dry, arid parts of the world where it is collected to provide water not only for plants but also people.*

Nobel laureate poet Rabindranath Tagore once wrote, *"Let your life lightly dance on the edges of Time like dew on the tip of a leaf."*

What does he mean?

It is easy sometimes to be disheartened, to think that whatever we may do for good, is only a "drop" in the ocean. That we will never change anything. I suggest we would be wrong. The many single drops of dew on my lawn, changed how I saw it. The one single drop was a source of beauty and refreshment. The lives we chose to live have the potential to be life giving to all creation. May our lives be like dew drops, bringing beauty, and refreshment, gently and lightly to all around.

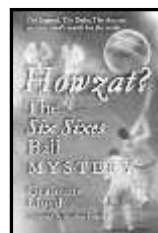

Direct is a small Christian Charity based at Hitchin. There are very few admin staff and the project leaders are all volunteers Brian and I have been involved with them since 2010. They never rush into a country and tell them what they need; they look for small building projects already up and running and join with the local workers, and the funds we raise go direct to the project (hence the name) so there is no chance of it being misused. We have seen the need and seen the difference that Mission Direct makes to small struggling projects. A school up in the mountains, a refuge for young girls, community centres where people can be safe and receive training, a maternity hospital for low class women, and so much more. Therefore, we are so pleased that The Hempnall Group of Churches have chosen Mission Direct as their Lent Appeal.
