Dear Friends,

There are times in our lives when we face difficult decisions. Often it is not a matter of right or wrong, but making the best decision in the circumstances we find ourselves. Who do you go to for advice?

I heard recently of an elderly lady, living on her own, struggling to decide whether to stay in her home or go into residential care. For four months she agonised over what to do. It affected her health and she became depressed. Then someone she had not seen for a long time asked about the people that were important to her, who had supported her in her life. What would they say? There were five people in particular who came to mind, people she valued and trusted. All of these people were now sadly dead. She thought about them and what they might say to her. Over the coming months she came to the decision to stay in her home. Her health improved and depression lifted. Now as she enjoys life in her home, sure she has made the best decision, and moreover, she continues to feel supported by these companions.

Bishop Graham has written a book in which he identifies forty people whose lives he has found compelling. He says that each of these people, who he calls "companions", although they have now died, they are very much alive in his life, continuing to inspire, guide and influence him. Some are family members, others historical figures, you might well be surprised to see who is on his list. Who would your five people be, or forty?

If we human beings are made in the image and likeness of God, then we should expect to see that nature reflected in our fellow men and women. And so God's guiding influence comes to us, as it did to the woman I spoke of, and Bishop Graham.

Afraid, alone, in pain

## SMASH! But seriously.....

There have been 6 road traffic accidents in the last 18 months on the bends between Kilbourn's and Cunningham's garages.

All involved people who know and drive the road regularly. So far the damage has been limited to walls, fences and gardens, but if it continues it is only a matter of time before someone is seriously injured or worse. Please, think and drive carefully and adjust your speed if the road is wet or slippery.
