I wonder what gives you courage to face the challenges of life, what gives you comfort when there is no other way than to go other than through troubles or fears?

My dear aunt, who reached the wonderful age of 92 years died recently. I miss her. In later life we had become very good friends. Psalm 23 is often used at such times, as it was at her funeral, but it is also a psalm for living. I often imagine Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane, a man just like, praying to God to refresh his soul, calm his fears and guide him in life as he approached the single greatest adversary.

"The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.

He makes me lie down in green pastures;

he leads me beside still waters;

he restores my soul."

Life was not all green pastures for him, neither is it for us. In Israel/Palestine it rains from November to early February. This means that the fields are only green for two and a half months of the year; otherwise they are brown and dry. This reality is very much like life. Green sometimes, with ease of living, at other times hard and dry. Psalm 23 is saying, that even in dry hard times, God will provide that "tuft" of greenness to nourish us and a "still" place of refreshment in troubled waters.

What gives me courage and comfort?

Well, being here with you in the Hemphall Group, a place where I find acceptance, love, kindness and compassion. Knowing I am with people here, and in other places, where I can be myself. Knowing there are those who will listen to me, without trying to make me feel better, and that offer practical help when needed. Such communities of faith and communities of love, give me and us courage and comfort at such times. Thank you all.
