Our Lent Charity - Help put a smile on refugee faces



Gautam Sharma runs West Earlham
Dental Practice. He is a trustee of the
Dental Mavericks Charity, and formed
part of an international contingent of 50
dentists, healthcare assistants,
translators and cultural advisors who
work in Lebanon with refugees.
He says of his last visit: 'This was my
second trip to the region, so I had some
idea of what to expect this time, but even

so, I don't think I was quite prepared for the relentless pace of the number of patients coming through to be seen.

'We started early each morning and finished late into the evening, every day treating close to 300 Syrian and Lebanese children. I was heartened to see that we were making less extractions than on our previous visit, but still the need is high, and we were welcomed with open arms and treated with huge gratitude by every single patient,' he added.

Our hearts start beating just a few weeks after conception and will beat about 2 billion times over a 70-year lifetime. This fist sized muscle pumps over 7000 litres blood around our body every day. CVD (Cardiovascular Disease) affects approximately 7 million people in the UK and is the cause of one quarter of early deaths. So, what can we do to protect this vital organ? There are some things we cannot change such as our individual genetic risk or increased risk in some ethnic groups; however there are many things lifestyle measures that have a positive impact on our heart health. A healthy diet and regular exercise contribute to avoiding obesity, controlling our blood pressure and cholesterol levels, and reducing the risk of diabetes, all of which are risk factors for heart disease. Not smoking and drinking alcohol within safe limits are also vital for heart health. Another factor is trying to limit the levels of stress in our day to day lives. For more information about "Heart Health" we would like to welcome you to our educational evening at Long Stratton High School, kindly organised by our Patient Participation Group on Thursday 23rd April 2020 from 7pm – 9pm. This evening will be supported by Norfolk Accident Rescue Service (NARS) who will hold a training session on CPR at the beginning and end of the evening, with a talk in between from heart specialists. Top 10 gardening tips for March

- 1. Protect new spring shoots from slugs
- 2. Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes
- 3. Plant summer flowering bulbs
- 4. Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials
- 5. Top dress containers with fresh compost
- 6. Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed)
- 7. Cut back Cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems.
- 8. Hoe & mulch weeds to keep them under control early
- 9. Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain, remove pond heaters.
- 10. Prune bush and climbing roses.
