Gardening Tips for November

Clear up fallen leaves - especially from lawns, ponds and beds. Raise containers onto pot feet to prevent waterlogging.





Plant tulip bulbs for a spring display next year.

Prune roses to prevent wind-rock.

Plant out winter bedding.

Cover brassicas with netting if pigeons are a problem.

Insulate outdoor containers from frost - bubblewrap works well.

Stop winter moth damage to fruit trees by using grease bands around the trunks.



Put out bird food to encourage winter birds into the garden. Use a seasonal bonfire - where this is allowed - to dispose of excess debris unfit for composting.
