

Topcroft Parish Council Flooding Advice

HAVE YOU BEEN AFFECTED BY FLOODING?

There are many reasons why flooding occurs. If you know of any blocked ditches, culverts or other flood related problems, please send details including the area/s affected, to the Clerk to the Parish Council, to assist your Parish Council in compiling data of problem areas. Please reply to topcroftpc@gmail.com – your information will be treated confidentially.

On this leaflet we have put together a list of agencies you can contact if we have extreme rainfall again. The list is by no means exhaustive but we feel there is enough information for you to put into your address books or mobile phones.

You can also sign up with the **Environment Agency** for useful advice and alerts and they list all the advice you need to help make your home safe from flooding.

Organisations responsible for flood warnings and who are able to provide assistance in areas affected by floodwater:

Environment Agency

- Issues flood warnings for flooding from rivers, the sea and groundwater
- Receives and records details of flooding incidents.
- Monitors the situation and advises other organisations.
- Deals with emergency repairs and blockages on main rivers and own structures.
- Responds to pollution incidents.

Norfolk County Council

- Co-ordinate's emergency arrangements.
- Maintains safe conditions on the roads.
- Puts floodwater signs on the highway.
- Organises road closure and traffic closures.
- Clears blockages on highway drainage systems.
- May take action to protect property from flooding by water from the highway where there is a failure of the highway drainage system.

This month we have national awareness weeks dedicated to mental health and Eating disorders. Having written about adolescent mental health recently, it is only right to discuss the important subject of eating disorders. The prevalence of eating disorders has increased massively in the last 40 years here in the UK and worldwide. Here in the UK, it is known that around 1.25 to 3.4 million people are affected by an eating disorder and around 25% of this number are male. Eating disorders are most common between the ages of 16 and 40. Most of the eating disorders start in the adolescent period.

NICE defines Eating disorders as a persistent disturbance of eating or eating related behaviour which leads to altered intake or absorption of food and causes significant impairment to health and psychosocial functioning.

The main types are:

- 1. Anorexia nervosa there is an intense fear of gaining weight. There is severe restriction of food intake or persistent behaviour which interferes with weight gain.
- 2. Bulimia nervosa recurrent episodes of binge eating followed by compensatory behaviour such as self-induced vomiting, use of laxatives or excessive exercise.
- 3. Binge eating disorder recurrent episodes of binge eating in the absence of compensatory behaviours.

4. Atypical eating disorders – symptoms of anorexia nervosa or bulimia nervosa which do not meet the precise diagnostic criteria. An example is a person who has all the features of anorexia nervosa and has lost significant weight and yet the person's weight is within or above the normal range.

There has been considerable research into eating disorders. It is known that the cause is multifactorial. This can be classed into:

- Biological factors family history of eating disorders, changes in the brain or hormone levels
- 2. Psychological factors lack of confidence or self-esteem or being a perfectionist
- 3. Social factors bullying, difficulties with school or work or abuse

What help is available:

If you are aware of anyone with eating disorders, encourage the person to approach their GP.

The Garden in February....

10 Top gardening jobs this month

1. Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover





- 2. Chit potato tubers It's important with earlies, and a good idea with maincrops, to 'chit' the seed potatoes before planting. This means allowing them to start sprouting shoots.
- 3. Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines and peaches
- 4. Most top fruit and soft fruit are very hardy but once they start into growth in spring, flowers and buds are especially vulnerable to frost and may need protection to crop well.
- 5. Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off



6. Prune winter-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering



- 7. Divide bulbs such as snowdrops, and plant those that need planting 'in the green'
- 8. Prune Wisteria
- 9. Prune hardy evergreen hedges and renovate overgrown deciduous hedges
- 10. Prune conservatory climbers such as bougainvillea
- 11. Cut back deciduous grasses left uncut over the winter, remove dead grass from evergreen grasses



Thought for the month...

Hello Everyone,

I have been watching "The Green Planet", a BBC 1 production with David Attenborough; it's worth seeing.

Did you know there is another WWW? It's right under our feet, a hidden fungal network through which trees talk to each other and share resources; it has been nicknamed the Wood Wide Web. We may think of trees as solitary individuals but this network creates a thriving community between individuals as they "chat and swap" information. For example older trees use this system to supply shaded seedlings with sugars giving them a better chance of survival. Trees that are sick and dying may "dump" their resources into this network which can then be used by healthier neighbouring trees. If they are attacked they send chemical signals which warn their neighbours to raise their deterrents. Scientists are still debating why trees behave in this altruistic way.

The wisdom of John Donne, writing in the 16th Century is no less true for us in the 21st century. "No man is an island, Entire of itself, Every man is a piece of the continent, A part of the main. There is more that unites us, seen or unseen.


