Knitting Challenge.....

Do you enjoy knitting?



Please help us

to provide knitted sheep to give the children at Christmas and Poppies for Remembrance Sunday. You can knit these at home in your

own time or, it you prefer, there will be opportunities to do this with others at Knit & Natter sessions in Topcroft and Hempnall.

If you have any odd bits of wool you would like to donate please drop them into the Group Office (for address see back page). All poppies should be dropped off at the group office by 3rd October and all sheep by 7th November

Happy Knitting!

Pattern for the sheep



I used DK yarn for the head, body, legs and ears and size 2.75 mm needles (US size 2). This finer needle gives the required tighter fabric.

Different yarns vary in the way they knit up but here is the pattern I used. Please adjust if necessary to suit your own requirements. I experimented with stocking stitch and reverse stocking stitch, both are suitable, it's a matter of personal choice.

Body - Cast on 14 stitches, knit 16 rows. With a large sewing needle take the stitches off onto a length of yarn and draw up. With wrong sides facing stitch the long edges together. You should now have a tube. Turn to the right side, stuff and draw up the open end to make a fat sausage shape.

Legs (knit 4) - Cast on 6 stitches and knit 8 rows. Cast off. Roll up the knitted piece as tightly as you can to form a tiny sausage shape and stitch down the open edge (no stuffing required). Stitch the tops of the legs to the body as shown above.

Head - Cast on 9 stitches and knit 10 rows. Take stitches off onto a sewing needle and draw up. With right side facing (because head is too small to turn inside-out) neatly oversew the long edges together. Lightly stuff the head and gather the open end. To give the head a realistic curved shape push the threaded needle from the nose end through the head and out of the top. Pull until you have the required curved shape then fasten off. Decide which end is better for the nose and stitch the head to the body (see picture above).

Ears (knit 2) - Cast on 3 stitches and knit 2 or 3 rows. Remove stitches onto sewing needle and draw up, this makes the pointed end of the ear. Oversew down the ear to the base and stitch it to the top of the head (see picture above).

Now you can give the sheep a face. I used embroidery floss.

Now comes the fun part...dressing the sheep. You can create different coats

from different yarns, in other words anything goes!

I used 3.75 mm (US size 5) to make a soft fabric.

Basic coat - Cast on 10 stitches and knit the required number of rows to wrap over the sheep's back from one side to the other. Cast off. Fold in half and with wrong sides facing. Stitch together the edges at one end to form the back end and a very short seam (about 1cm) at the front. This will fit under the sheep's head. You must leave an opening large enough at this end for the sheep's head to pass through. Turn right side out.

Knitted Poppies

For the best finish, knit with a Double Knit (DK yarn). The size of needle you choose will



determine how big the poppy will be, but we recommend 3.5mm or 3.75mm (UK9).

If you have different yarn left in your stash, just use that and the appropriate needle size. If you have any problems with any of the techniques in the poppy patterns and you have access to the internet you will find lots of tutorial videos on youtube.

EASY GARTER/KNIT STITCH PATTERN FOR BEGINNERS

Colour A Red (one ball will make a lot of poppies!)

Colour B Scrap of Black or a black button

Body of Poppy

Using Col A cast on 120 stitches.

Rows 1-4 Knit

Row 5 Knit 3 stiches together across the row(40 stiches)

Rows 6-9Knit

Row 10 Knit 2 stitches together across the row(20 stitches)

Rows 11-14 Knit

Row 15 Knit 2 stitches together across the row(10 stitches)

Cut yarn leaving a tail of about 20cm Thread tail through yarn needle and slip all the remaining live stitches onto the yarn tail and pull tight. Pull around into a circle and then mattress stitch (or use whatever stitching you normally use) to seam for an invisible seam.

Sew in ends.

Centre of Poppy

Using B, cast on 16 sts. Cast off. Coil into a tight spiral and sew base to the centre. Or use a black or green button with 4 holes and sew to centre of poppy. Add pin.

EASY RIBBED POPPY PATTERN

Colour A 1 ball red yarn (this will make a lot of poppies)
Colour B Scrap of black yarn or black button

Body of Poppy

Using Col A Cast on 60 stitches Row s1 –10: K2, P2 across whole row (for a slightly smaller poppy do 8 rows of rib).

Row 11: Knit 2 stitches together across the row (30 stitches).

Row 12: Slip 1 stitch, Knit 2 stitches together then pass the slip stitch over... repeat across the whole row (10 stitches).

Break off yarn with long tail and thread back through remaining stitches and pull tight.

Join edges with mattress stitch

Centre of Poppy

Using B, cast on 16 sts. Cast off. Coil into a tight spiral and sew base to the centre. Or use a black or green button with 4 holes and sew to centre of poppy. Add pin.

As you read this month's magazine, we would officially have entered the season of Spring 2022. Spring brings in a sense of hope, a sense of new life and a sense of brighter and warmer days. In this month's article, I am quite excited as I introduce our new GP, Dr Amy Hodgson, who has taken over some of the patient's list from Dr Verity Lowndes -Burt who left us in January. Amy was our GP Registrar and some of you may have met her in the past 2 years. The practice and the partnership welcome Amy warmly in her new role as a GP. Having helped with her training and development from a junior doctor to a fully qualified GP, all of us in the practice have a sense of pride and feeling of fulfilment. Amy agreed, without any hesitance, to write about herself and this what she has to say:

I am originally from Cambridgeshire and spent some time growing up in North Yorkshire too before moving back to East Anglia in my teens. I trained in Norwich at UEA and graduated in 2013. After completing my foundation years, I joined the GP training programme and first worked at LSMP in 2015, before moving into secondary care with the training programme. I then rotated through various departments at the NNUH, did some public health and research work and had my two children before returning to LSMP in 2020 to complete my training. I am really excited to be 'back' as a fully qualified GP!

I am passionate about lifestyle medicine and promoting good physical and mental wellbeing wherever possible. I truly value being able to get to know my patients within their own context. The Garden in April - Sunshine and Showers....

Spring is finally in evidence as daffodils and flowering trees continue to bloom after the sunny days in March! Expect April showers this month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month, with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing outdoors. Just watch out for frosts.

1. Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wild flower seed outdoors
Sowing seeds outdoors is an easy, inexpensive and fun way to grow new plants. It's ideal for a wide range of hardy flowers and vegetables.



2. Protect fruit blossom from late frosts

Most top fruit and soft fruit are very hardy but once they start into growth in spring, flowers and buds are especially vulnerable to frost and may need protection to crop well.

- 3. Keep weeds under control
- 4. Start to feed citrus plants
- 5. Increase the water given to houseplants
- 6. Feed hungry shrubs and roses



7. Tie in climbing and rambling roses

Rose pruning ensures that plants grow vigorously and flower well each year. Although often considered complicated, rose pruning is not difficult if you look up a good guide.



- 8. Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
- 9. Prune fig trees
- 10. Divide bamboos and waterlilies

How can we celebrate Easter when we find ourselves in the midst of so much tragedy and suffering? The question "why" does not easily die away, it just gets asked with ever greater passion. Jesus hurled the same question to his God as he died. We too are constantly faced with the dark dimensions of human nature which can, at times, cause even the most resilient spirit to quiver and quake, and there are times in all our lives when we feel despondent, broken and defeated, there seems to be no real hope in the world.

Easter is the promise of God for our broken world. In the midst of war, pandemics, disasters of many kinds, a new way is possible. Evil and injustice will be wiped away. True peace will reign. Easter is a vision of the future with God.

Perhaps this Easter we may know again, in spite of all our faults and failings as individuals and as a world we can never put ourselves out of the reach of God's love, and so go on to grasp the fresh start that awaits each of us every day.
