

Managing non-native species in ponds Tuesday 5 July

7-8.15pm

This online workshop offers the opportunity to find out how to identify and manage non-native species in and around Norfolk ponds, with expert guidance on prevention, control and eradication led by Liam Smith of Norfolk Non-native Species Initiative. Online

Introduction to practical scything Thursday 7 July

The Great British Hedge Survey Saturday 16 July 10am – 1pm

Learn how to assess the condition of hedges with expert instruction from the People's Trust for Endangered Species. As part of our **Claylands Wilder Connections Project** we are running Citizen Science Campaigns. Each season we're asking you to record your sightings of three species that make a home in the South Norfolk Claylands, to help us get a better picture of the areas that support these creatures and to help guide future conservation work.

Turtle dove, water vole, and glow-worm are the third set of species to be selected because of their association with summer and the species' need for large areas of connected habitat here in South Norfolk.

We are in the middle of Summer 2022 and I do hope you are all enjoying what summer brings along with it. Do look after yourselves and use adequate sun protection factor and ensure adequate hydration.

I have chosen a rather sensitive topic this time. As the Safeguarding lead for children and adults in the practice, I do have a role that brings mixed emotions with it. There is strong sense of wanting to prevent any harm happening to our patients. This is done through adequate training, ensuring that policies and processes are in place and that staff can bring to our attention any concerns they have noted during their interaction with patients. Prevention of harm is always the best policy. Yet on the other hand, I am aware that this can cause massive stress to all concerned. The important baseline message is that everyone should feel safe. Hence my choice of subject this time – Domestic abuse or violence. The UK government's definition of domestic violence is 'any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive, threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are, or have been, intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality. The abuse can encompass, but is not limited to psychological, physical, sexual, financial, emotional.' There is help and it is readily available 24 hours. I am adding the numbers that anyone can access if concerned.

- 1. **999** ask for the police if worried about immediate danger

- 5. **Bright Sky app** Bright Sky is a mobile app and website for anyone experiencing domestic abuse, or who is worried about someone else.
- Women's aid If you are experiencing domestic abuse or are worried about friends or family, you can access the Women's Aid live chat service 7 days a week, 10am to 6pm. helpline@womensaid.org.uk

- 7. **Ask for ANI codeword** If you are experiencing domestic abuse and need immediate help, ask for 'ANI' in a participating pharmacy. 'ANI' stands for Action Needed Immediately. If a pharmacy has the 'Ask for ANI' logo on display, it means they're ready to help.
- 8. **Safe Places** can be in a shop like boots, an office, station or library. Find your safe place at https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/safety/safe-places/about-safe-places/find-a-safe-place

If you are concerned that a new, existing or former partner may have an abusive past, you can ask the Police to check records under the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (also known as Clare's law).

The Garden in July....

Summer is progressing

This is often one of the hottest months of the year and a great time to sit out and enjoy your garden. Keep plants looking good by regularly dead-heading, and you'll enjoy a longer display of blooms. Make sure you keep new plants well watered, using grey water where possible, and hoe off weeds, which thrive in the sunshine.

1. Deadhead bedding plants and repeat-flowering perennials, to ensure continuous flowering—

Keep plants looking attractive and encourage more blooms, whether in beds and border, containers or hanging baskets.



2. **Care for houseplant while on holiday**—Most houseplants will tolerate a few days' absence without suffering, but absences of more than a week call for some creative measures to provide valuable moisture in the right quantity.





- 3. Water tubs and new plants if dry, but be water-wise— Watering is one of the most important jobs when growing plants in containers. Roots need a balance of air and water to grow well which is easy to provide if you have a good quality compost or soil.
- 4. Check clematis for signs of clematis wilt
- 5. Pick courgettes before they become marrows
- 6. Treat apple scab
- Clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up
- 8. Order catalogues for next year's spring-flowering bulbs
- 9. Give the lawn a quick-acting summer feed, especially if not given a spring feed
- 10.Harvest apricots, peaches and nectarines
