Topcroft Social Club Chairman's Report

The Recreation Ground and Social Club are continuing to build and develop following from the disruption of Covid.

The new bar staff are very supportive and thanks to some hard work around publicity and promotion we have recruited new members. We continue to be able to open regularly every Friday evening and these evenings have been enhanced by regular "Take away" nights throughout the winter, we intend to extend this into BBQ evenings in the summer with the lighter evenings. We also transferred the successful quiz nights to Friday evenings. We were able to return to running both Christmas and Easter Bingos and this year Father Christmas joined us for the carols which contributed to a great family evening. We also had a very successful "Irish Night" to celebrate St. Patrick's Day which hopefully will become an annual event.

The facilities continue to be used by local groups and DJ's for dance events, and another Music Weekend is planned for June as well as an "Indiefest" this April.

The cricket club use the field, pavilion and bar throughout the summer and the new Code of Conduct promoted better relationships between the two committees. They continue to run Junior practice sessions on a Monday evening when many local children participate. They run two men's teams, a ladies team, and a variety of junior/senior teams.

The pavilion is hired on a regular basis for Art Classes, Pilates and Yoga and has also been hired on an irregular basis by other groups and for parties etc. Norfolk Youth Services have hired the pavilion to provide workshops for local youngsters and the Home Education Group again ran a successful Charity Family Day.

The ambitious building plans still remain on hold at present there has been a lot of changes to various funding and grant schemes post-covid so we await the cricket club's application. However we have pressed ahead with the redecoration of the corridor and ladies toilet and we are in the process of applying for grants for more extensive changes to the toilets, cellar and kitchen. We propose to install Solar Panels to help long term with our energy sustainability.

We have some events planned for the Coronation weekend and have a "Curry Night" coming up to extend our regular Friday nights. We hope to return to holding our regular events such as Harvest Supper towards the end of the year. We have several new members whose enthusiasm and energy have revitalised the committee and raised the profile of the Recreation Ground and Social club in the community.
